LEGISLATIVE AND PROGRAM UPDATES

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE: 2023 Appropriations Act

Three new programs:

Primary Care Providers and Psychiatrists FELS Program

- Establishes a FELS program for primary care providers and psychiatrists practicing in Tier 1 and Tier 2 counties
- Appropriates \$8M NR for two years

Early HS Graduate Scholarship Program

- Effective for 2025-26
- Establishes Early Graduate Scholarship for students who graduate in 11th grade
- Two semesters over two academic years at an NC college or university

Common Digital Transcript

 Provides \$7M NR to SEAA to contract with CFI to create a common digital transcript between DPI, community colleges, and UNC constituent institutions



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE: 2023 Appropriations Act

Multiple changes to existing programs:

SEAA as Scholarship for Children of Wartime Veterans fiscal agent

New cohort of Longleaf Commitment Community College Grant Program Reauthorization of Washington Center Internship Scholarship Program

Summer term for NCSSM and UNCSA Tuition Grants

Expansion of Teaching Fellows Program Removed Selective Service Registration requirement for State-funded scholarships Conformed State law for in-State tuition for military-related individuals to federal requirements



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE: 2024 Session

- "Short session" begins April 24
- Focused on adjustments to 2023 Appropriations Act and bills that have passed at least one house in 2023
- Will request technical updates to Need-Based Scholarship for Private Institutions
 - Statute still refers to EFC, amend to "demonstrate need according to federal methodology in Title IV of the Higher Education Act to reflect the change to SAI
 - Simplify how residency is described in NBS statute



NEXT NC SCHOLARSHIP 2024-25

NEXTNC Scholarship Most NC students with AGI ≤ \$80K will qualify for at least \$5K to attend a UNC institution and \$3K to attend a NC community college

File a FAFSA to apply

How it works:

- Combines federal Pell Grants and state funds to ensure students get at least the minimum awards of \$5,000 for UNC and \$3,000 for NCCCS
- Eligible students have AGI < \$80,000 and SAI (federal need calculation) < \$7,500
- More aid is available based on need



NEED-BASED SCHOLARSHIP 2024-25

- 2024-25 formula amended to account for Pell/SAI changes and mirroring Next NC
- Changes include:
 - 2024-25 transitional payment schedule
 - Formula beginning with 2025-26
 - Shifting to per credit hour model
 - Minimum award of \$5,000
 - Summer funding beginning in 2025
 - Added half-time eligibility
 - Removed full-time plus category
 - Full-time low-cost category unchanged





OTHER PROGRAM UPDATES

Additional 2024-25 Program Changes

- Will shift all EFC-based programs to SAI
- Will shift programs to a per credit hour model, *where possible*, to mirror Pell Grant

Training

- Scheduled new financial aid administrator trainings:
 - April 15–17 at CFI
 - May 20–22 at Cape Fear CC
 - October 9–11 at McDowell Tech CC
- Three regional (East, Central, and West) state aid workshops will be scheduled in the fall of 2024
- Additional intermediate aid officer workshops will be offered throughout 2024



FAFSA DATA

NC FAFSA COMPLETIONS: HS Seniors

- National data compares FAFSA completions by estimated counts of high school seniors. Among the 50 states,*
 - NC ranks **18th** in completion rate.
 - NC ranks **5**th in percent increase over last year.

- NC calculates its own rate based on actual counts of high school seniors.
 - 62% of 2022-23 seniors completed a FAFSA as of September.

MARKETING AND OUTREACH SUMMARY

Next NC/NC Need-Based Scholarship for Public Colleges and Universities

- Funded by \$1.25M NR from 2021 Appropriations Act to "raise awareness of changes to the scholarship programs for students attending public colleges and universities"
- New contract with APCO Worldwide
- Temporary, specific campaign to increase awareness of available funding

CFNC

- Funded from various sources, including interest earnings on loan sale proceeds
- Contract shifted to APCO Worldwide
- Multifaceted, ongoing campaign, including:
 - Countdown to College
 - Other campaigns throughout the year
 - CFNC.org
 - NC FAFSA Hub (temporary)

- FAFSA research and messaging

CFNC BRAND RESEARCH: SURVEY RESULTS

Key Pros

- Name recognition for CFNC is higher than most tested higher ed orgs but has declined since '12.
- Audiences have favorable views of College Foundation of North Carolina (CFNC), driven by CFNC's financial aid and application support.

Key Areas for Change

- Few critiques, mainly focused on difficulty in accessing information and applying to college.
- Messaging outlining all the organizations involved in CFNC can have a negative impact.
- CFNC's support for private colleges, HBCUs, and career/technical schools isn't as well known.



NC FAFSA RESOURCES

More than half aren't certain they would complete FAFSA even if they were considering higher ed

While most self report a likelihood to complete the FAFSA, we know that hypothetical ideals aren't the same as real action. Interestingly, rates of those who say they definitely would complete it are similar for adult students and high school families. The audiences diverge when we get into softer or negative opinions. Adult students are less likely to complete FAFSA, especially prospective students who are older (55+), male, Republican, or live in rural areas.
